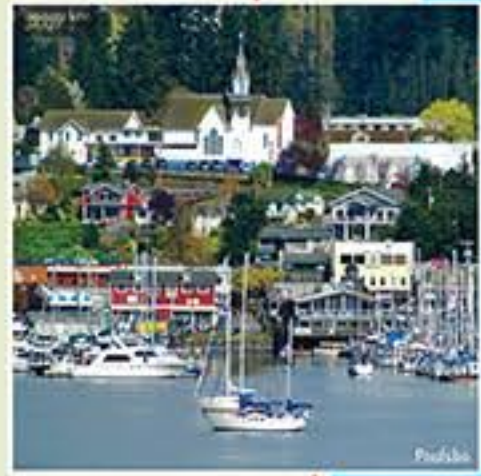

A Few Popular Water Trail Routes

Bainbridge Island – Eagle Harbor

Explore picturesque Eagle Harbor on the leisurely Eagle Harbor Loop (Route D) or visit the interesting geologic formation Blakey Rock (Route E) to the southeast of the island.

Poulsbo – Liberty Bay

Explore Liberty Bay and see the wildlife that it is famous for by paddling from the Poulsbo Marina to Oyster Plant Park (Route F), head to the north end of Liberty Bay on the relaxed, protected paddle to Dog Fish Creek (Route G), or do both together.

LIBERTY BAY ROUTES F & G

Silverdale – Dyes Inlet

Launching from the Silverdale Waterfront Park you can make your way to Anna Smith Park (Route I) or paddle south to the mouth of Chico Creek (Route J) where you can see spawning salmon jumping from mid October thru November.

Bremerton – Ostrich Bay

Launching from Tracyton Boat Ramp, cross southwest to Rocky Point, pass Mud Bay, after rounding the second peninsula you will make your way south into Ostrich Bay where you can paddle around and stop at N.A.D. Marine Park.

Port Orchard – Sinclair Inlet

From the Water Street boat launch make the nice paddle along the Port Orchard waterfront to Annapolis (Route K) or paddle west to Gorst Creek (Route L) where the salmon return to spawn mid-October thru November.

Gig Harbor – Skansie Park

Enjoy a sheltered paddle in the lovely town by doing the Gig Harbor Loop (Route N). Take time to stop by the Lighthouse and visit any of the several downtown parks, or make the trek to Sunrise Beach Park (Route O).



Key Peninsula – Carr Inlet

Paddle the sheltered Burley Lagoon (Route P) or explore Raft Island (Route Q) and Cutts Island (Route R) from Kopachuck State Park.

Union – Hood Canal

Paddle around scenic Seabeck Bay (Route X), take some time to explore the mouth of the Skokomish (Route Y), or see spawning salmon in Union River (Route Z), Chinook, Coho, Chum mid-September thru November and Steelhead February thru May. Planning Your Water Trails Trip

Challenging conditions on Puget Sound can create problems for water trail users who may lack boating skills and familiarity with its unique conditions. Safe boating requires good boating skills; knowledge of Puget Sound conditions, navigational safety and security rules; and good planning for each trip. All boaters should know how to read and use tide and current tables to predict conditions that they may encounter.

Boating Safety Gear Checklist

All watercraft should be of appropriate size and design for the boater and conditions. You should never exceed manufacturer's recommendations.

About the KPNWT

In early 2000, local outdoor recreation enthusiasts, led by the North Kitsap Trails Assoc. and John Kuntz, owner of Olympic Outdoor Center, worked with Kitsap County to create a master trail plan to take advantage of the regions land and water trail assets. In time, Visit Kitsap Peninsula and other organizations and individuals got involved to promote the land and water trails to attract visitors. Sue Abbott, Community Planner for the National Park Services, and long-time supporter of the trail plan, suggested the group submit an application to be part of the National Water Trails System. In late 2010, Kitsap County Commissioners agreed to take the lead and assigned staff to assist with the application process. It took nearly three years to complete and on June 23, 2014, the U.S. Department of the Interior announced that the Kitsap Peninsula Water Trails are now officially part of the US National Water Trails System—the first in Washington State.

The official dedication took place on June 2015 at the Silverdale Waterfront Park and was attended by dignitaries from federal, state and local agencies. The dedication included a blessing by the Squamish Tribe. Residents and visitors from around the region celebrated the day on the water in the annual Ride the Tide event from Bremerton to Silverdale. Today, the *Kitsap Peninsula National Water Trails* is a major destination for kayaking, SUP, boating, scuba-diving, fishing, and events. The KPNWT supports tourism and contributes to the region's growing reputation as a destination for outdoor recreation. The application process was used to create the *Kitsap Peninsula National Water Trails Alliance* that includes representatives from cities, counties, tribes, port districts, businesses, organizations, users and volunteers. The mission of the KPNWT Alliance is to support and promote the *Kitsap Peninsula National Water Trails* for the public use and enjoyment of residents and visitors.
