Although supported by the National Park Service, National Heritage Areas are unique in that they are locally run and completely non-regulatory."

Director Beth Javens added her team has "touted the importance of Kitsap County adding yet another designation to the region in addition to the <u>Kitsap Peninsula Water Trails system</u> to travel writers and journalists some of which will be visiting our area this spring.
